

MULTICULTURAL RESOURCES FOR CHILDREN

To find multicultural information, search the library catalog at <http://www.ocls.info> for subjects like ethnicity or multiculturalism. You can begin with these titles:

- J 306 Mil *Hands Around the World: 365 Creative Ways to Build Cultural Awareness & Global Respect*
Presents a variety of games and other activities to promote awareness of different cultures around the world.
- J 398.2 Mil *Tales alive! :Ten Multicultural Folktales with Activities*
Contains 10 multicultural folktales, with corresponding crafts, recipes, or activities.
- J 641.59 VEZ *Passport on a Plate : a Round-the-World Cookbook for Children*
Describes the culinary styles of twelve regions around the world and provides recipes for each, including Africa, the Caribbean, and China.
- J 641.59 VEZ *The Kids' Multicultural Art Book : Art & Craft Experiences from Around the World*
Includes background information and instructions for more than 100 craft projects from African, Native American, Eskimo, Asian, and Hispanic cultures.

[NoveList](#)

NoveList includes more than 120,000 fiction titles, 90,000 reviews, and 36,000 subject headings to assist readers in locating favorite or new authors, to find “read-alikes”, and titles in series for adults, young adults and children. Check for the *Features for Teachers* for articles about integrating multicultural literature into classroom curriculum.

[Lit Finder](#)

Provides access to thousands of full text poems, stories, plays, and speeches. Browse multicultural genres and subjects, such as: Ethnic and Regional Writing, Foreign Writing in English Translation, and Places and Geography.

[Rosetta Stone](#)

Use Rosetta Stone to learn a new language or brush up on your world language skills. Simply click on the link (Library or Home/ Office) and register as a user at the Learning Express Library. Once you log on choose "Language Learning From the Rosetta Stone" on the top left side of the page to begin your session.
