Books about Zora Neale Hurston:

- 813.52 Aca *All about Zora: Views and Reviews by Colleagues and Scholars*, Proceedings of the Academic Conference of the First Annual Zora Neale Hurston Festival of the Arts, January 26-27, 1990.
- 813.52 Hurston *The Character of the Word: The Texts of Zora Neale Hurston*, by Karla F.C. Holloway. Criticism and interpretation of Hurston's work.
- 813.52 Hurston *Zora in Florida*, edited by Steve Glassman and Kathryn Lee Seidel. "...focuses on the place that nurtured and inspired Zora's work, the frontier wilderness of Central Florida and the all-black town of Eatonville."
- 813.52 Hurston *Zora Neale Hurston* (Bloom's biocritiques), edited by Harold Bloom. Gathers together the most useful criticism so far available by respected scholars and critics.
- 813.52 Hurston *Zora Neale Hurston: A Literary Biography*, by Robert E. Hemenway. Fascinating biography of Zora with a forward by Alice Walker; includes a bibliography of the author's writings.
- 813.52016 New *Zora Neale Hurston: A Reference Guide*, by Adele S. Newson. A great source to locate detailed information about Zora's works and her life.
- 813.52 Hurston *New Essays on "Their Eyes Were Watching God,"* Interpretations of one of Hurston's best known works.
- B Hurston *Sorrow's Kitchen: The Life and Folklore of Zora Neale Hurston*, by Mary E. Lyons. A remarkable story about Hurston's life, written especially for young readers.
- B Hurston *Zora Neale Hurston* (Black Americans of Achievement Series), by Paul Witcover. Young adults will enjoy this straightforward, clearly written account of Hurston's life.
- B Hurston *Zora! Zora Neale Hurston: A Woman and Her Community*, edited by N.Y. Nathiri. A very colorful and picturesque guide about Zora and her community.
- JB Hurston *Jump at de Sun: The Story of Zora Neale Hurston*, by A.P. Porter. The story of Hurston's life written for young people.
- JB Hurston *Zora Neale Hurston: The Storyteller's Life*, by Janelle Yates. A children's biography of this inspiring woman.

Books by Zora Neale Hurston:

- 398.3 Hur *Mules and Men.* A treasury of African-American folklore collected by the author.
- 812.52 Hug *Mule Bone:* A comedy of Negro Life, by Langston Hughes and Zora Neale Hurston.
An energetic and farcical play by two great literary figures of this century.
- 972.92 Hur *Tell My Horse: Voodoo and Life in Haiti and Jamaica.* Hurston's first-hand account of the weird mysteries and horrors of voodoo.
- B Hurston *Dust Tracks on the Road: An Autobiography.* "...Hurston's exuberant account of her rise from childhood poverty in the rural South to a place of prominence in the pantheon of American writers."
- Fiction *Complete Stories.* "...landmark gathering of Zora Neale Hurston's short fiction.
- Fiction *Gilded Six-bits.* In this tale, an African-American couple learn about love and forgiveness.
- Fiction *I Love Myself When I am Laughing...and Then Again When I Am Looking Mean and Impressive.* Fourteen selections chosen for their literary quality and historical significance.
- Fiction *Jonah's Gourd Vine.* The story of lovable John Pearson, an African-American preacher...this is Hurston's first novel.
- Fiction *Moses, Man of the Mountain.* "Moses of the Old Testament, and the Moses of Negro Myth, legend and song are superimposed to create a new reading of the Exodus story."
- Fiction *Seraph on the Suwannee.* Zora's last novel, which was her only novel that was not focused on the African-American culture, but on a southern white woman.
- Fiction *Spunk: The Selected Stories of Zora Neale Hurston.* These stories focus on the rural African-American community of Eatonville, Florida and on Harlem during the height of the Harlem Renaissance.
- Fiction *Their Eyes Were Watching God.* Considered to be Hurston's most outstanding achievement.
