Ignite your child’s entrepreneurial passions as the Orlando Public Library hosts the Third Annual Orlando Children’s Business Fair

(Orlando, Florida) November 3, 2019 - The 2019 Orlando Children’s Business Fair will host young entrepreneurs and future business moguls at Orlando Public Library on Sunday, November 17 from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. This event is free and open to the public.

The Orlando Children’s Business Fair, in partnership with Action Academy and Acton School of Business, is a one-day marketplace where children and teens will debut their innovative inventions, market their services or products, and build marketing strategies. It is a part of the Orange County Library System’s BizKids initiative which introduces young people to classes and events with a focus on promoting

entrepreneurship and skills such as planning, marketing, financing and more. The children are responsible for setting up their tables, sales and interacting with customers. Featured businesses that have been selected to participate this year include Succulentsaurios, Escape Room In a Box and Paula's Teacup Fairy Gardens.

“Today’s youth are tomorrow’s business innovators and leaders. The Children’s Business Fair gives students the opportunity to spread their entrepreneurial wings and get a head start on promising business careers,” said Jeff Sandefer, founder of the Acton School of Business, one of the sponsors of the fair.

Cash prizes of \$50 will be awarded for three categories each, including “Most Business Potential,” “Most Creative Idea,” and “Most Impressive Presentation.”

Last year, the Fair showcased more than 40 youth-run businesses with over 700 people in attendance. Attendees purchased products from young vendors who sold artwork, soap, Lego accessories, baked goods, photographic services, handcrafts and more.

The 2019 Orlando Children’s Business Fair takes place at the downtown Orlando library on Sunday, November 17.
