FROM THE INTERIM DIRECTOR

ne of the most important relationships Orange County Library System has is with Orange County Public Schools. We strive to ensure that every school in the county has a library staff liaison who provides them with information about library events and services, and we collaborate with OCPS on a variety of initiatives, like virtual field trips, virtual library services and providing library card sign-up applications to students.

To help teachers make the most of our relationship with schools, we host a special event for educators every summer to help them learn how the library can aid them in the classroom and beyond. We call it Library U, and it offers presentations, experiences and demonstrations that shed light on what the library has to offer educators and students. Some teachers who visit for the event are amazed by all of the things the library has to offer that they don't know about, like live online tutoring for students, language learning and databases that can help kids do research or write papers.



This year's Library U takes place on Thursday, June 9 from 8:30 to 11:30 a.m. Elementary, middle and high school teachers and media specialists can participate. Topics that will be covered this year include a hands-on experience in the library's Melrose Center; virtual library cards and the tools they unlock for students who have access to them; and virtual field trips and how they enhance the classroom experience. Just like all of our events, Library U is free. Registration is required and closes June 7. Sign up at ocls.info/libraryu.

Another thing we do every summer is host our annual Summer Reading Program. This year's program launches on June 4, and after two years of virtual-only events and programs, we're looking forward to bringing back in-person experiences at all locations. We'll host some of our most popular performers, like OrisiRisi African Folklore, Gatorland's gator wranglers, Yehaa Bob and Jiggleman, as well as some newer experiences, like Curbside Circus, which wowed audiences with outdoor performances at select branch locations last year.

We've also got a challenge for you – help us reach our Summer Reading Program community reading goal of 2 million minutes. If we had 3,334 people read at least 600 minutes this summer, we could easily reach that goal. To participate, sign up for the Beanstack app and create an account with your library card so you can log your reading time online. Last year, we set a community reading goal of 1 million minutes, and we far exceeded it with more than 1.8 million minutes read and logged by the community. Let's make sure we get to 2 million in 2022!



A BLACK GIRL'S **REFLECTIONS OF LOVE AND RESILIENCE Eatonville Branch** Tuesday, June 14, 5 p.m. Actress and songstress Patrece Bloomfield takes you on an artistic journey through the history of Juneteenth.



e spoke with Black entrepreneur, Dr. Trenessa Williams, owner of the online bookstore Kizzy's Books & More, to discuss African American literature and her upcoming library event as we honor Juneteenth.

What ignited your passion for African American literature?

What really got me to enjoy African American literature was poetry. That's how I learned about Langston Hughes, Paul Laurence Dunbar and other authors who wrote about the African American experience. Poems that ignited my passion for Black literature were: We Wear the Mask by Paul Laurence Dunbar and Ego Tripping by Nikki Giovanni. When I was younger, I remember sneaking and reading For Colored Girls by Ntozake Shange. By reading books, especially books that dealt with the African American experience. I was able to relate because it told our story and it brought light to our experience.

What is Juneteenth? What does Juneteenth represent to you?

Even though Abraham Lincoln signed the Emancipation

Proclamation stating they were free on January 1, 1863, it took 2.5 years for word to get to the African American slaves in Galveston, Texas. They didn't know they were free. Juneteenth is the celebration for those African Americans finally getting the word they were free. They celebrated, they prayed and they danced.

When I think about what Juneteenth is, it's a celebration of our experience as African Americans and the history of where we were, what we've been through and where we're going in the future. It's a promotion of our culture: past, present and future.

Why is your goal of opening a brick-and-mortar bookstore in Parramore significant to this neighborhood?

In 2008 when the concept of Kizzy's Books & More came to be, I was looking at what areas I wanted to have that bookstore. I knew about Parramore, but as I was doing research, I found out the richness of the history, and how it was one of the oldest Black neighborhoods in Orlando. I knew that part of Parramore was going to be gentrified and redeveloped. I knew I wanted to have a location in that area because

it was an influential, prominent neighborhood back in the day. We don't have a place where we can go and connect with African American culture and literature. When Montsho Books died, there wasn't another place that could fill that void.

As a Black-owned bookstore, what do you hope to bring to the community?

I hope to bring a safe place where lovers of African American literature and culture, and those who love to read can come together and have a place where they can read and connect over a book. Reading is the most amazing thing and books can connect people that never have really connected before. I hope to bring to the community a space to promote literacy, especially for those who love to read or those who are trying to rediscover reading.

How can bookstores and libraries help serve the Black community?

Bookstores and libraries can provide resources that can help students who lack reading proficiency. Reading is the gateway to everything you know. You need to be able to read to be able to work. You need to be able to read to do anything.

What are you looking forward to discussing in your virtual event, Working with Bookstores as an Author, on June 16?

I'm excited about the whole event! I'm excited about really connecting with authors to provide them with insight on what they need to do to get their books on shelves. I want to provide them with the do's and don'ts so they are prepared and have an understanding of the process.

l am a Queer Man

icardo Burney, a circulation clerk for Orange County
Library System, will lead guests
through a thought-provoking event
in celebration of Pride Month. He
will discuss why intersectionality
is important as a Black man in the
LGBTQ+ community. "It shows us that
identities work on multiple levels and
that oppression cannot be reduced to
only one part of an identity," he says.
"Each oppression is dependent on
and shapes the other."

Together with staff from Peer Support Space, Burney will tackle the mental health effects of discrimination. Drawing upon the experiences that have shaped him, he will present on the lives of other Black gay men who were prominent historical or political figures. "I hope to create conversation around these topics, and that this gives all of us an opportunity to better understand each other."

Burney served in the military during the controversial "Don't Ask, Don't Tell" era – a risk which could have cost him, and many other LGBTQ+ military personnel, their careers. When not in uniform, Burney reveled in the spotlight as he transformed into his drag persona, Bernice Labelle.

His significant contributions and involvement in the community has led to many awards, including Miss Gay Monterey (1995) and Dual Empress (1997). "In the beginning, there was a contingency of embarrassment associated with being a drag queen," Burney said. "I wasn't proud, and I certainly didn't understand the platform that was afforded to me. It is now later in life that I realize the incredible power of drag, and I see that part of my life as a badge of honor."

Today, Burney volunteers with Turn About, an Orlando organization that helps make HIV and hepatitis testing available at no cost. Reflecting on his work in the LGBTQ+ community, his lived experiences and the research he's done, Burney shares that it's had a positive impact on his life. "True authenticity is achieved by embracing both my blackness and queerness. They are the sum of who I am."

Do you have any memories of visiting the library with your family?


